The parts of speech:

**Adverbs** tell how an action was done and often end in -ly. They often modify a verb or an adjective or another adverb and answer the questions how, when, and where, or describe the condition or reason, such as: happily, carefully, very, rather, here, there, now, quickly, surely, absolutely.

An **interjection** is an exclamation or silly word or phrase that shows strong feeling and is punctuated with an exclamation point, such as: Wow! Yippie! Hooray! Oh, no! Rats! No way!
