A Quick Review –

The parts of speech:

A **noun** is a person, place or thing, such as: Coach Patterson, Frog Alley, touchdown, cheer.

A **verb** is an action word or describes a state of being, such as: jump, throw, study, learn, help.

Past-tense verbs describe actions that already happened, such as: ran, kicked, made, reached, caught.

An **adjective** describes the qualities or characteristics of a noun or pronoun, such as: tall, smart, purplish, feisty, resourceful.

Adverbs tell how an action was done and often end in -ly. They often modify a verb or an adjective or another adverb and answer the questions how, when, and where, or describe the condition or reason, such as: happily, carefully, very, rather, here, there, now, quickly, surely, absolutely.

An **interjection** is an exclamation or silly word or phrase that shows strong feeling and is punctuated with an exclamation point, such as: Wow! Yippie! Hooray! Oh, no! Rats! No way!
